VOYAGE STATISTICS

The benefits of sailing with TSYT are proven and long-lasting. We take a lot of care to assess the impact that our work has on those who sail with us. Feedback from recent voyages show:

- 83% were actively involved in supporting and planning activities.
- 83% felt more able to cope with stressful or challenging situations.
- 91% were able to support others to build their skills and knowledge.
- 91% were able to plan ahead to reduce risk in challenging situations.
- 91% took responsibility for personal organisation and time management.
- 95% felt more competent as a member of the voyage crew by the end of the voyage.
- 95% were able to lead and take responsibility for others and tasks successfully.
- 95% felt more confident about setting goals for the future.

YOUNG PEOPLE SURVEY RESPONSES

We asked the young people how they felt before joining the trip – some responses are below:

- I was a little nervous, but I was excited to experience it!
- Worried I wouldn't fit in with the other crew members.
- I felt nervous and wasn't sure if I wanted to go sailing in the first place.
- I was nervous about being on a ship for the first time and worried about being around people I have never met.
- I felt a bit nervous and unsure how it would go and whether I would enjoy it.
- I was a bit nervous about meeting new people and sailing for the first time. I was also excited to go sailing.

After their voyage, we asked the young people for their voyage highlights:

- I loved it when the sea got rough, and the boat was rocky and me and another crew member had to sweat the ropes, but we kept falling over and laughing about it.
- Raising the main sail during very strong weather.
- Seeing the girls bond and support each other.
- Driving the ship, hoisting sails, learning knots, and making friends and laughing with them.
- Seeing the dolphins and the watch systems were new and exciting night sailing was also an enjoyable aspect.
- Experiencing the watch systems was a massive highlight as it showed me that it wasn't as easy as I thought but also that even when it got hard you got on with it and you make the best out of what you have.
